# Message from the CEO and President of the Board

## MESSAGE FROM THE CEO

In my first year as CEO of the Alzheimer Society, I have witnessed the commitment of the incredible volunteers, supporters, board and staff who give so much to an organization dedicated to making a difference for Manitobans impacted by dementia.

I have spoken with many of you – people diagnosed with dementia, family caregivers, donors, sponsors and health care professionals – to learn what you think we should be doing. Some of you wanted us to do more of what we currently do, such as family education and regional workshops. Others expressed a desire for the Alzheimer Society to continue helping caregivers navigate the health care system and access community resources.

You voiced concern that many Manitobans are diagnosed with dementia, yet comparatively few are accessing our support. You told us that people need to know that the Society offers services not only for those with Alzheimer's disease, but also for individuals with other forms of dementia and their family members.

A number of you mentioned the need for more research dollars, while others discussed the importance of continuing our advocacy efforts, including responsive and appropriate services, government focus on the importance of a dementia strategy and ensuring that people can get the care needed for their family member after a diagnosis is made.

I have listened to what you want done and learned from what you told me. I look to the year ahead with optimism as we continue to adapt and grow to best serve every Manitoban touched by dementia.

## MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD PRESIDENT

After 20 years of tremendous leadership by Sylvia Rothney, the CEO torch was passed to Wendy Schettler, and the board couldn't be more pleased with the seamless transition that has taken place over the past year.

Wendy has proven to be a strong leader with the right skills and background for this pivotal role. Her passion for the cause and her ability and desire to reach out to those living with and impacted by dementia give her clear focus on how to guide the organization as we move forward.

There is much to do. People impacted by this disease need more programs and services to support them through their journey and more hope that effective treatments – and even a cure – is on the horizon. The Alzheimer Society of Manitoba needs to prepare to meet this challenge.

We would like to recognize the Government of Manitoba for its support of several key programs. # About Our Role and Goals

## ABOUT THE ALZHEIMER SOCIETY OF MANITOBA

Founded over 30 years ago, the Alzheimer Society of Manitoba is the leading health charity for people living with Alzheimer's disease and other dementias.

The Society provides programs and services to enhance the quality of life for people with Alzheimer's disease or another dementia and their families. Currently, there are more than 20,000 Manitobans living with the disease.

The Society offers: supportive counselling; caregiver and professional education; support groups for people with dementia and for their caregivers; public awareness; the MedicAlert® Safely Home® program; the First Link® program; research funding and more. The Society is also a prominent voice in advocating for change within all levels of government.

## WHAT IS DEMENTIA?

The word dementia is an "umbrella term" for a variety of brain disorders. Symptoms include loss of memory, judgement and reasoning, and changes in mood and behaviours. Brain function is affected enough to interfere with a person's ability to function at work, in relationships and in everyday activities.

### Types of Dementia


Different types of dementia are caused by different physical changes to the brain. The most common forms of dementia in order of prevalence are:

- Alzheimer's disease
- Vascular dementia
- Lewy body dementia
- Frontotemporal dementia
- Creutzfeldt-Jakob disease

# How We Help

## SUPPORT FOR PEOPLE WITH DEMENTIA AND THEIR FAMILIES

### Experiencing Dementia

Two **Experiencing Dementia** series were offered in 2013-14. This eight-week program promotes dialog about future planning and care between people with dementia and their care partners.

### Support Groups

Three **weekly support groups** for people with dementia were offered over the past year, and 31 **caregiver support groups** were available across Manitoba, including bilingual groups in Ste. Rose du Lac and Notre Dame de Lourdes.

### First Link®

Through the First Link® program, 401 people were referred to the Alzheimer Society in 2013-14. This represents a 31% increase over last year.

### New Clients

New clients continue to reach out to the Society with 1,472 receiving support over the past year. Continuing clients rose by 35% for a total of 2,194 individuals who received help.

## EDUCATION

The large growth in registration confirms the heightened demand for education, support and access to community resources.

### For Caregivers and Family Members

**Telehealth** attendance grew tremendously with four education sessions delivered to 32 sites via video technology (770 attendees).

**Care4u Family Conference** was a great success with 294 attendees. Caregivers connected with specialists to learn about community resources, self-care tips and strategies to better support family members with dementia.

Seven **Family Education sessions** were offered in Winnipeg. Attendance at these sessions ranged from 13 to 55 people with an average attendance of 28.

Thirteen **Living with Alzheimer Disease workshops** were held, reaching 367 caregivers. The sessions provide a better understanding of Alzheimer's disease from a medical, family and individual perspective.

### For Health Care Professionals

The **P.I.E.C.E.S.™ training** helped 858 health care staff learn more about providing informed, compassionate care for people with dementia.

The two-day **Dementia Care Conference** was attended by 533 health care professionals who learned creative, new ideas on how to better care for people with dementia.

### For the Public

**January Awareness 2014** emphasized the importance of early diagnosis. The forum "Dementia... Answers You Need" (65 attendees) addressed topics recently featured in the media.

**Public awareness presentations** reached 2,437 Manitobans with information about the warning signs of dementia, brain health and the importance of including those with dementia and their caregivers in community life.

## ADVOCACY

### A Renewed Framework for Alzheimer's Disease and Other Dementias in Manitoba

The Alzheimer Society participated in a working group chaired by Manitoba Health that developed a renewed strategic document. The framework will provide the vision for dementia care in Manitoba for the next five years. The renewed framework is slated for release in 2014.

# How We Helped: Spotlight on Research

## NATIONAL RESEARCH PROGRAM

*THE ALZHEIMER SOCIETY OF MANITOBA* contributed \$79,940 to the research of emerging and established investigators by its support of the Alzheimer Society Research Program. This annual, peer-reviewed competition is administered by the Alzheimer Society of Canada. The aim of the program is to offer the best hope of finding a cure for Alzheimer's disease and other dementias. To date, over \$40 million has been invested in this cause.

### Winnipeg Researcher Receives Funding

Dr. Tiina Kauppinen is an assistant professor in the Department of Pharmacology and Therapeutics at the University of Manitoba. She is also a Principal Investigator in Neuroscience Research at the Kleyesen Institute for Advanced Medicine at the

Health Sciences Centre. In her study, *The Role of PARP-1 as a Modulator for Microglial Functions in Alzheimer's Disease*, Dr. Kauppinen developed her own unique mouse model system that allows her to specifically manipulate brain immune cell activation in mice with Alzheimer's disease. She is able to prevent immune cell activation and will evaluate the effects on different cell types present in the brain, as well as overall disease progression. She is similarly evaluating the effects of continuous brain immune cell activation in Alzheimer's disease while also looking at whether brain immune cells have similar roles in female and male mice.

Dr. Kauppinen is thankful for the support from the Alzheimer Society Research Program. The funding she is receiving allows her to carry out her project and access new technologies, which otherwise would be cost prohibitive.



## GRADUATE STUDENT FELLOWSHIP RESEARCH PROGRAM

*THE ALZHEIMER SOCIETY OF MANITOBA* understands the importance of stimulating graduate student interest in dementia. What better way to encourage more research than to support today's grad students, who will become tomorrow's scientists?

To that end, the Society provides \$8,000 in funding to researchers under its Graduate Student Fellowship Research Program. The awards are provided in two areas: biomedical and psychosocial. Congratulations to the following 2013-14 recipients:

### Sheila Novak

Sheila Novak is a graduate student at the University of Manitoba in the Department of Community Health. She was inspired to study dementia by her mother, who lived with the disease for 11 years after showing signs of early onset dementia at age 50.

Sheila's research study will look at administrative data to profile the health and needs of people with early onset dementia living in personal care homes in Winnipeg. She will also interview caregivers to explore how people living with early onset dementia and their caregivers navigate the health and social care system, including access to

diagnosis, community supports and personal care homes. Sheila has almost completed the course load for her PhD, and she plans to defend her proposal in early 2015. The funding is assisting her in these studies.

In addition to this research project, Sheila has also been analyzing data about family members of people with dementia for another research project. Sheila hopes her research will ultimately help raise awareness of early onset dementia.

### Bethany Craig

Bethany Craig is a graduate student at the University of Manitoba in the Department of Psychology. She is working towards a Master of Arts in Applied Behaviour Analysis.

Her project, *Functional Analysis of Problem Behaviour in Dementia: Are Standard Methods Effective?*, is a behavioural assessment study with the goal of assessing and identifying the probable function of specific problem behaviour in an individual.

The study will determine whether or not functional analysis is an effective tool to assess individuals with dementia. Her data will provide important information for clinicians on how to assess and eventually treat behaviours, which could help delay placement in long-term care.

Overall, she hopes this will contribute to an increase in the quality of life for individuals with dementia and their caregivers.





# A Little Help From Our Friends

FUNDRAISING EVENTS WERE HELD ACROSS MANITOBA throughout the year to support the work of the Alzheimer Society. We are very appreciative of the generosity and the enthusiastic participation of our attendees, sponsors, donors and volunteers. Here are some highlights from our fiscal year of April 2013 to March 2014.

## FUNDRAISING EVENTS

### Investors Group Memory Walk

**June** – Thousands of people joined Walks in 68 communities and personal care homes throughout Manitoba for the Investors Group Memory Walk. At the Winnipeg Walk, more than 1,100 participants and over 70 volunteers came out to our new venue – the Scotiabank stage area at The Forks. The Investors Group Memory Walk raised more than \$314,000 province wide.

### Motorcycle Poker Derby

**August** – More than 100 motorcycle enthusiasts joined in the Motorcycle Poker Derby in Brandon and raised over \$12,000 for the Alzheimer Society.

### Coffee Break®

**September & October** – Almost 400 individuals and organizations hosted Coffee Break® events throughout the province raising over \$68,000 for the Alzheimer Society.

### Manitoba Liquor & Lotteries Trivia Challenge

**October** – 193 trivia buffs participated in the Manitoba Liquor & Lotteries Trivia Challenge in Winnipeg and raised more than \$21,000 for the Alzheimer Society.

### Door to Door Canvassing & Donor's Choice

**January** – Close to 400 people braved the elements and canvassed door to door in neighbourhoods across Manitoba during one of the coldest winters in over 100 years.

**Throughout the year** – Canvassing takes place in Donor's Choice communities all over Manitoba.

These combined canvasses raised almost \$115,000 for the Alzheimer Society.

### A Night to Remember Gala

**February** – More than 900 guests attended the "Night to Remember in Ireland" Gala in Winnipeg and over \$293,000 was raised. Guest speaker, Amanda Radul, shared the story of her personal journey with dementia.

**March** – 144 people participated in the annual Chili Cook Off in Brandon and over \$3,100 was raised.

## MARILYN DAVIS

Marilyn Davis has proven herself to be a long-standing, kind, reliable and hardworking volunteer who has dedicated her energy to the Alzheimer Society for many years. She became interested in volunteering after she received assistance from the Society's Caregiver Support Group

at the Tuxedo Villa in the early 1990s when her mother had dementia. "I knew what it was like and I wanted to help," she says of her decision to become a co-facilitator for the Tuxedo group, a position she has held for over 10 years.

Marilyn has assisted in many other ways over the years. She has volunteered at fundraising activities, such as Memory Walk and the Door to Door campaign, assisted at the Care4u family conference, and has been a media spokesperson for the Society on several occasions. She has already been honoured with a 15 year volunteer recognition pin and will receive her 20 year pin in 2015.

In more recent years, Marilyn found herself reaching out for help from the Alzheimer Society again when her husband was diagnosed with dementia. "I want to continue helping to raise awareness so that people who are struggling know they can turn to the Alzheimer Society for help," she says.

It is with pleasure that the Alzheimer Society presents Marilyn with the Distinguished Member Award for 2013-14.

## PEARL SOLTYS

Pearl Soltys is a devoted volunteer whose relationship with the Alzheimer Society goes back over 20 years. Her early work involved assisting in several different capacities, including participating on the advocacy committee, leading workshops for caregivers and meeting

Alzheimer Society supporters while working on the Door to Door campaign. She also helped to produce, as well as present at, the Dementia Care conference for health care professionals.

Through this initial association with the Society, Pearl recognized the exceptional qualifications and dedication of the Society's staff. "It was clear to me that the Alzheimer Society was an efficiently and compassionately run organization and that my volunteer efforts could be extended to benefit people with dementia in Manitoba," she explained. This realization led Pearl to take a leadership role by becoming a volunteer board member in 2005.

In the years since then, she has served as President, Vice President and Past President of the board. She also spent four years as the Manitoba representative on the board of the Alzheimer Society of Canada. During that time, she developed an even stronger confidence in the Alzheimer Society of Manitoba, believing that "it is doing all that it can and more!"

Already a 20 year volunteer recognition pin recipient, it is a great honour for the Society to present Pearl with the Distinguished Member Award for 2013-14.

# Financial Report

## FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

### STATEMENT OF OPERATIONS FOR THE YEAR ENDED MARCH 31, 2014

Fundraising events and campaigns revenue increased by \$58,926 largely due to growth in participation at events.

Donations were down by \$40,790 compared to 2012-13 due to a large bequest received that fiscal year.

Client Services expenses increased by \$50,520 largely due to an increase in First Link® program services.

Community Development expenses increased by \$35,251 largely due to the addition of the Parkland Office.

Grants revenue grew by \$60,761 due to increased funding of First Link®.

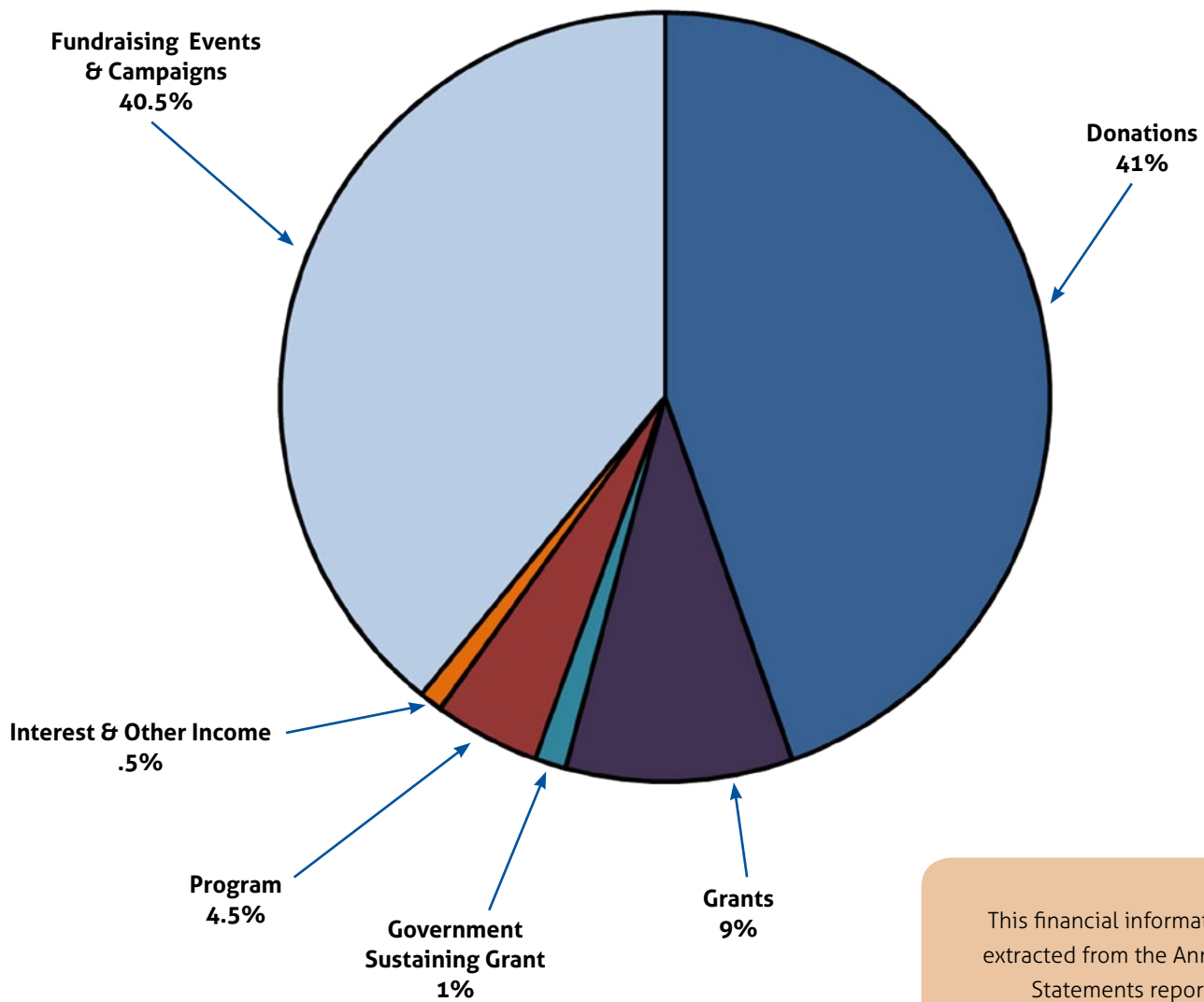
### Costs Defined

- 1. Client Services** – Costs related to the delivery of information, support, education and advocacy for people with dementia and the family and friends who care for them.
- 2. Community Development** – Costs related to the delivery of programming that increases community awareness of dementia and the Society's reach to Manitobans.
- 3. Education** – Costs related to the purchase of resource materials and the development, delivery and evaluation of workshops, seminars and conferences for health care staff.
- 4. Organizational Development** – Costs related to the governance of the Society, including board meetings, board recruitment and training, strategic planning and the Annual Report. It also includes general staff training and main database system support and maintenance.
- 5. Program and Office Administration** – Costs related to the infrastructure support of the programs and services of the Alzheimer Society, including the administrative staff support to program and fund development, and expenses related to management of finance and administration.
- 6. Research** – Costs related to funding for provincial and national research initiatives.
- 7. Revenue Development** – Costs related to fundraising initiatives, direct mail campaigns, administration of online donations and planned giving programs.
